From the President

Spring is slow to arrive in Sainte Marie (SM). An early April visit revealed a flooding river that fortunately did NOT close the road going north, a few daffodils blooming, and still the dreary look of winter-grey. Everyone is ready for warmer weather, especially the farmers. But a rural community carries on with heads held high, so optimism blooms in Sainte Marie.

Plans for Grand Opening Aug. 30

We're having *a ribbon-cutting at the Foundation House on Sat.*, *Aug. 30.* Our agreement with the construction company, DCA, who gave us the House, has ended, so the House is totally ours to use as we see fit.

We intend to have a formal ceremony starting with an Honor Guard from the American Legion Post #932 at 1 p.m. and a short program to honor all the volunteers who have given extraordinary time and resources to renovating this old house. There will be music – a string band with Judy Helregel Millsap, son Ryan and daughter Krista (plus more), as well as refreshments. The Museum officially opens with the exhibit Sainte Marie: Touched by War, featuring stories and artifacts of SM citizens' involvement in wars from the Spanish-American War to present-day conflicts. Come explore!

This grand opening is a *don't miss* event, followed by an Open House on Sunday, Aug. 31 during the church picnic. More details in next newsletter.

The Patio Project

Kenny Hartrich grew up in Sainte Marie (SM) and loved his hometown, even though he moved to Newton years ago. He was the "go to" person when anyone needed info about Sainte Marie history. He planned the Hartrich/Picquet Reunions and made sure that people had an opportunity to tour the historical town on each occasion.

So when Ken died in 2013, his wife **Sandra** wanted to do something <u>in</u> Sainte Marie to honor his memory. She donated \$2,000 to the Foundation in his memory, with the hope that we would buy benches or something similar on which we could engrave Ken's name. The Foundation Board was planning to put a patio on the south side of the Foundation House, so Sandra's gift gave us the incentive to execute our plan. The patio will include a large center stone honoring Kenny and his love for Sainte Marie.
